MINISTER'S WELCOME


Dear UUCCI Members and Friends,


Giving – Look up your giving history, set-up recurring pledge payments, or make other gifts online at https://uucci.breezechms.com/give/online



Columbus Pride Festival

Maybe you are horrified and outraged by Indiana's efforts to harm LGBTQ, especially Transgender youth. If you don't know, there were 27 anti-LGBTQI bills in congress this year. Five of the bills passed and went into effect on July 1st.

- 1) Prohibiting bans on harmful conversion therapy - intended to "make" gay people straight; (SB350)
- 2) Banning books from School Libraries which have LGBT themes making Librarians face prison for sharing these books (HB1447)
- 3) Schools cannot offer human sexuality instruction thru 3rd grade (wasn't taught anyway) but includes school personnel must notified parents if students request to be called by a different name or pronoun, outing trans youth (HB1608)
- 4) Banning Gender Affirming surgery in prisons (there has only been 1 case ever) (HB1569)
- 5) Prohibiting Transgender health care for children younger than 18...especially problematic for puberty blockers which help the child not develop sexually until later when they are older and can make more permanent decisions --- and children who have been taking hormone therapy and are forced to quit, which is harmful to the child. (SB480)

Are We Living through a Zombie Apocalypse?

Tools for Surviving the End of the World

OCTOBER 15



We begin a six-week series of Facing Our Monsters by exploring the metaphor and meaning of Zombies. Since 1968, when The Night of the Living Dead released in theaters, zombies have been depicted in many art forms and become a central figure in the pantheon of monsters in popular culture. From Haitian Folklore to Thriller to preparing for the zombie apocalypse, what is it about zombies that is so frightening and yet fascinating? Rev. Nic Cable will explore the twin realities we face in the post-pandemic world: 1) our fear of the other and 2) the rise of white nationalism in the United States.

Dracula in Drag:

Recognizing Our Humanity through a Vampiric Lens

Dracula specifically and vampires generally symbolize many aspects of society's discomfort with topics related to sex and gender. From the hypersexualization of gay men, to the projection of predatory behavior on members of the LGBTQ+ community, to the linking of disease and sexual deviance especially during the AIDS epidemic, vampires represent both a distortion of our humanity and a gateway to understanding our humanity in a more sacred and holistic light. Rev. Nic Cable will consider what is possible if we break free from the limitations society and we put on our expressions of sex and gender.

It's Alive!!!

Dr. Frankenstein, His Monster, and Our Not So Secret God Complex

There is irony and yet import in our often confusing Dr. Frankenstein and his Monster. Both have monstrous tendencies and both are aching for human connection and happiness. Yet, it is Frankenstein who seeks to be The New Prometheus and play God with the power of technology. Rev. Nic Cable will explore the very human longing to play God, avoid loneliness, and find happiness in the world.







The Elephant in the Room is a Ghost:

A Memorial Service for All Souls Past and Present

Remembering and talking about our loved ones who have

died can be very painful, even decades after a death. Many struggle to process or transform one's relationship with the dead, preferring instead to not acknowledge what may feel like the elephant in the room. Rev. Nic Cable will guide our annual memorial service that aims to assist our community in acknowledging "those who have died have never, never left." In their transformation, we may come to see them in

new ways and from there continue on our journey in life.

Every year at UUCCI's Annual Meeting, we acknowledge our shared ministry and congregational life together. Can Hydra Ever Be Slain?

Unleashing Generosity in the Face of Uncertainty, Fear, and Death

The "work to overcome injustice in all its forms" is like Hercules trying to defeat the many-headed Hydra; as soon as you attack one injustice, three more injustices emerge beside it. It can be demoralizing and leave one feeling hopeless. Rev. Nic ends his six-part sermon series calling upon us to unleash the abundant multitudes within our hearts, so that we can grow the resources of our ministry no matter the number of monsters we face.

Chalice Circles are facilitated, small group gatherings, which meet once a month at UUCCI. The gatherings foster conversation on Monthly Themes and build community in a small setting. New for this year is an all woman's Chalice Circle.

WOMEN'S CHALICE CIRCLE

THIRD THURSDAYS FROM 10AM-12PM

This year Sharon Mangas is facilitating a Women's Only Chalice Circle. The Circle will meet once a month, from October through May, on the THIRD Thursday of the month. In the month of December, the group will meet on the SECOND Thursday of the month, to avoid meeting too close to Christmas. We will gather at UUCCI (room to be determined) from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon. If this time or day of the week doesn't work for you, Mark Kevitt, another experienced Chalice Circle Leader, will be facilitating a mixed Chalice Circle Group. Dates for Mark's Circle are to be determined.

Chalice Circles are a small group ministry, unique to the UU denomination. A topic with a spiritual/thoughtful component is chosen for each session. Every meeting there is a brief "check in" to see how everyone is doing, followed by a lighting of the chalice, some opening words, 2-3 readings, a time to quietly settle in, and then we tackle questions for discussion. We emphasize deep listening in Chalice Circles. There is no "back and forth" conversation, but rather we give each person time to thoughtfully respond to a question, without interrupting or questioning them. After discussions are finished, the facilitator will watch the time, and bring us back to a closing reading/readings and a time for "check out" when it's getting close to time to dismiss.

We ask if you decide to join a Chalice Circle, that you will thoughtfully consider it and make a firm commitment to the group. Illness or being out of town are unavoidable at times, but a Chalice Circle works best when all participants commit (to each other) to be there every month.

Each year, Chalice Circles are asked to do at least one project benefitting the congregation, or the wider community. As an example, this past May, the Chalice Circle Mark and Sharon facilitated, helped organize and serve the "Welcome Back" meal on the first Sunday Rev. Nic was back after his sabbatical. It helps to start thinking of a project early on, as the months do fly by!

Chalice Circles are a wonderful opportunity to share, heal, and get to know fellow members of our congregation. We hope you will join us this year! Please let Sharon or Mark know if you would like to participate.
