Denominational Affairs

The Board is pleased to appoint Chris Kevitt to serve as our second delegate to June's UUA General Assembly. Chris will be attending virtually for the business portion of GA. Chris joins Cynthia Scott will be attending GA in Pittsburgh, PA. The Board voted last month to direct our two delegates to support the election of the Rev. Dr. Sofía Betancourt as President of UUA, effective the summer of 2023 for a six-year term. The Board also voted to support the continuation of the work of the Article II Study Commission for the coming year. Fiscal Matters

Operating fund pledges and the Sunday Service offering both provide monetary resources to meet our mission and are the foundation of our income. Another funding source approved by congregational vote in the 2023 budget was a number of fundraising events. While these events provide significant dollars for the congregation's work, it is not solely for the funds they generate that we do these events. Our upcoming June 2-3 Yard Sale, August 19 Auction and early December Holiday Market are all opportunities for us to be in community together, with each one of us offering the talent and skills that have created a proven track record of past successes. In Rev. Nic's absence for Sabbatical Leave, the members of Courageous Action Council continue to examine how to address the changing needs of our community and the larger society. Present members of the council are:

- Sondra Bolte, Welcoming Congregation
- Dick Boyce, Green Sanctuary
- · Cathy Caldie, Global Action
- Kathleen Leason, Racial Justice
- Patti Wade, Food Insufficiency (Hot Meals)

The Council is studying how to adequately respond to changing needs that fall outside of their traditional areas. These needs include immigrant justice, reproductive freedom, economic justice, homelessness, new challenges in environmental action despite many successes, voting rights, gun safety, and gender issues such as rights of trans and non-binary people.

The Council considered ways to approach these new challenges

- Combining forces to work on emerging issues as they pop up how do we stay up-to-date and keep the congregation informed?
- Focusing on issues being addressed by the state legislature but what about local and federal government?
- Focusing on a few selected issues each year but how do we determine the interest of congregation members, and keep up with community needs?
- Incorporating our goal of becoming a multi-faith community to work toward common goals are there opportunities to hook up with other faith groups?
- Maybe we should focus our energies on working with those agencies we have already identified as partners through our Split-the-Plate Decisions – can we look more deeply into their needs?

Courageous Action Council meets in odd-numbered months. Split-the Plate decision-making will be concluded at the May meeting. Members are welcome to share their ideas on the above questions with the people mentioned above.
