LETTER FROM THE MINISTER

DEAR COMMUNITY,

As I prepare for another congregational year, our ninth together, I am reminded of a lot of staff transitions I experienced my first weeks at UUCCI in July 2017. If you weren't here at that time, when I began bright-eyed and bushy-tailed, our beloved religious education professional, Susan Burton, told me on my first week of work that she was needing to resign due to some medical challenges she was facing. And then a few weeks later, our admin rock, Heather Wadley, shared that she anticipates in the next year being relocated with her husband and kids because he is in the military. Well, gee whiz, I felt, "hopefully seminary taught me all these essential tools for non-profit management!"

Thankfully, administration has been a passion of mine and we were able to adapt to those staffing changes and in fact have been on a staffing journey ever since. Through pandemic and financial uncertainty, through political upheavals and renewed hope, our staff team has seen many iterations in my time with you all, each with its own multicultural gifts and growing edges. Over the past couple months we said goodbye to Louise Hillery who served faithfully on staff for five years and a decade longer as a volunteer pianist and choir director. Louise was a cornerstone of our staff integrity and I celebrate her good service and return into the full life of the congregation. Thank you, Louise!

As August begins, to paraphrase the Prince song, I am "partying/ministering like it's 2017". Louise isn't just departing after years of faithful service, we are seeing new staff joining. In 2017 the new staff was not only me as your new minister, but also Deb Staebler and Kim Wadholm just around the corner. In 2025, there are also three new staff joining the congregation. Kaila and Gabby Lifferth will be starting this August as Music Director and Pianist, respectively. Judson Webb will join the team in a couple weeks as our Intern Minister. That's a whole lot of change, that's a whole lot of new, that's a whole lot of possibility!

In preparation for our staff retreat in a few weeks, I had each of our six person staff team take a short personality quiz online to identify the role they play in social change ecosystems. This is a part of a resource we will be utilizing this fall and on the journey ahead as a framework for thinking about the unique gifts we all bring to this community and the ways we can bring the best out of one another by fostering social change within the congregation, on the interfaith campus, and in the wider society that best aligns with our objectives, mission, and vision, as outlined in our Imagine 2030 strategic plan. Along with Sunday Services dedicated to this framework there will be adult programs and more ways to engage the content because the Unitarian Universalist Association named Social Change Now: A Guide for Reflection and Connection by Deepa Iyer the 2025-2026 Common Read. Stay tuned for more information!

In the meantime, I had a question that is a teaser for the journey we are embarking on this month. "What do you get when you bring together a Visionary, Two Experimenters, a Builder, Healer, and a Caregiver?" One amazing staff team! Those terms might not immediately register what it means given this social change framework, but I can say is that I feel so lucky to be surrounded by and personally supporting a staff team with many gifts. And while there will be a lot of new faces on staff this fall, here's the twist: there are more new faces within the congregation, and just as the staff each have gifts, so do you. I can't wait to learn more about your gifts, your passions, your interests, and your hopes for changing this world into the one we dream about. Imagine what a force, what a beacon, we can be in the world, when we lean into these gifts, when we lean into one another and face the challenges before us not in fear and despair, but with love and courageous action.






Civics Literacy Lab Wednesday, Sept 17 at 2 and 6 pm


