

### Flawed Music, Beautiful Memories

Have you clicked on the link called Hymn Preview in the recent Friday Reminders? Choir members and videographer Jeff Jones have put a lot of hours into recording our most often used hymns, so that you can be familiar with them before you come to a service.

If you have watched some of these preview videos, you may notice quite a difference in quality. We have learned through trial and error what works or doesn't work. One thing that doesn't work is recording in an empty parking garage on a windy Sunday afternoon.

However, when the people who made those videos see them again, we don't remember the roar of the vent motors and passing motorcyclists. We don't remember the hassle of carrying our hymnals and equipment into the garage and setting up, or the wind that whipped our hair and our pages. We don't notice the missed notes or fumbled words.

We remember how it felt to see each other in person after over a year of Covid isolation, after never singing with another person, because singing is a notoriously dangerous spreader of the virus. There were hugs and tears and absolute joy at being together.

And we remember the young couple, out for a Sunday afternoon walk, because meeting indoors was still dangerous. They heard us singing and climbed the stairs of the parking garage until they found us. And they sat quietly huddled together against the wind on the steps at a safe distance. They applauded every song and told us how beautiful it was to hear church music again.

# THROUGH TWO EYES: APPRECIATING THE AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORY OF INDIANAPOLIS

On September 9 of this year, several members of our UUCCI Racial Justice Team (and friends) went on a two-hour walking tour of Indiana Avenue in downtown Indianapolis. The tour guide, Sampson Levington, has been offering this eyeopening cultural experience since the summer of 2020. He takes his gaggle of walkers through the neighborhood that was once a cultural hub of African American businesses situated close to the homes of black and biracial residents. The walk helped us see what we normally would have missed if driving in a car. We learned about the history behind buildings that were spared when most of the neighborhood was destroyed to make space for new interstate highway construction in the 1970s.

Radio WTHR spoke with Sampson in 2020. "There is no record of Indianapolis as a city without African Americans here," Levingston said. "We've always been here; we are always going to be here. So, it's cool to celebrate where we once lived." Sampson showed us historic photos of the neighborhood so we could understand the changes we were observing. He helped us appreciate the cultural events and the popular jazz boom that took place there during and after the Harlem Renaissance, which was not limited to New York. Famous musicians from all over the country would come together for concerts and jam sessions.



The places I most remember from the tour are the Madam C. J. Walker building, the Kurt Vonnegut Museum, the AME church that is now occupied and preserved by Hilton Hotels, and the now-beautiful canal walk. We learned that the canal was originally a swampy smelly place separating black neighborhoods from the wealthier commercial parts of Indianapolis. It was regarded like the "other side of the (RR) tracks" commonly seen in towns across the Midwestand Southern states.

The tour was well-planned and structured, even down to safety issues at street crossings. Mr. Levington had a friend helping to ensure our safety by following stragglers and shepherding us in the right direction. We had no problem hearing the tour narration; Sampson had a portable mic. ### The Powerful Question:

How might we ensure our continued resilience and creativity so that we can inspire and nurture a more loving and courageous community?

### **Next Steps in 2024**

Unlike the Ends Setting Process of 2018-2019, we will take twice the time to not only renew the Ends, but to develop an accompanying strategic plan which we did not have for our first and current Ends. Here's how the Board will guide us through the coming year:

January 2024 — February 2024

The Board of Trustees will take all of our Stories, Wishes, and Art and distill the essence from them into some number of Ends.

March 2024

These Ends will be presented to the congregation at a Board Town Hall.

April 2024 — August 2024

Following that presentation, the Board of Trustees will begin to develop a strategic plan that would create measurable goals under each of the Ends that could be achieved or furthered over the next five years.

September 2024

The Proposed Ends and Draft Strategic Plan will be shared with the congregation for feedback.

October 2024

The Board will refine the Strategic Plan and vote to add it to the Annual Meeting Agenda.

November 2024

The congregation will vote on whether to approve Imagine 2030.

January 1, 2025

If approved, Imagine 2030 takes effect and guides our path forward through December 31, 2029.
